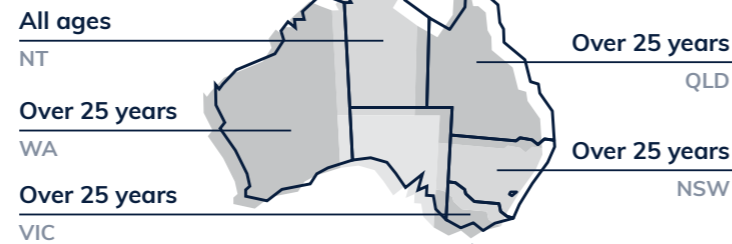

In NSW, QLD and ACT 1 hour with a professional instructor is counted as 3 hours driving in log book (capped at 30 hours).

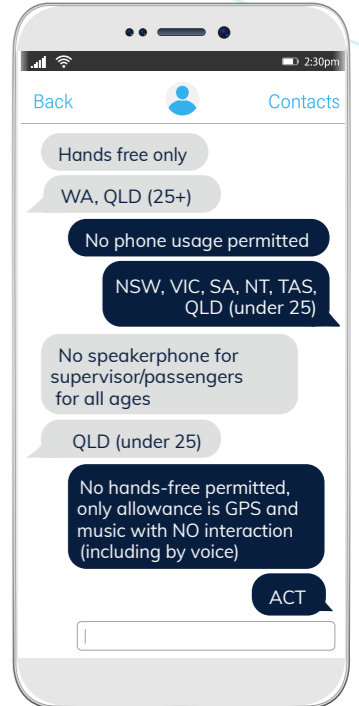

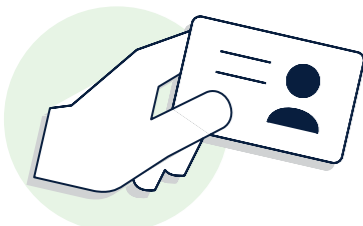
