No medical test
* NT: vision test every 5 years

SA

Annual self-assessment for C class licence for those aged **75+**. Annual medical test for all other licence classes for those aged **70+**.

NSW | Qld* | ACT

Annual medical test for those aged **75+**
* QLD must also carry a current Medical Certificate for Motor Vehicle Driver form at all times while driving.

WA

Annual medical test for those aged **80+**

Practical test required every 2 years unless driver chooses a modified licence. Modified licence means the driver can only drive in their local area. Licence limits vary.

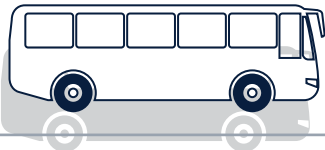

*SA - applies to all licence types except C class.

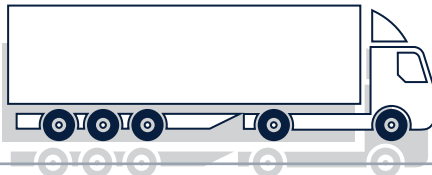
