## **Rules for older drivers**

by State and Territory

Medical exam	
Vic   Tas   NT	No medical test required but older drivers in NT must pass vision test every 5 years
SA	Annual medical assessment for all licence classes other than C for those aged <b>70+</b> .
NSW I Qld* I ACT	Annual medical test for those aged <b>75+</b> * QLD must also carry a current Medical certificate for motor vehicle driver form at all times while driving.
WA   Tas	Annual medical test for those aged <b>80+</b> or <b>65+</b> if holding a public vehicle licence in TAS

## **Unique State and Territory licence conditions**



	Condition	When this applies?	Where this applies?
C-CLASS LICENCE	Practical assessment is required every 2 years unless driver chooses a modified licence. Modified licence means the driver can only drive to familiar conditions. These vary but can include only using their local roads or driving at quiet times of the day.	Applies to ages <b>85+</b>	NSW
LR-CLASS LICENCE	Practical asessment may be required. *SA - Practical asessment required for any class of licence other than other than C class.	Applies to ages <b>85+</b>	WA I SA*
PUBLIC VEHICLE	Medical assessment and relevant driving assessment. Driver must pass the driving assessment relating to the authorisation they hold such as bus, taxi, or rideshare on an annual basis.	Applies to ages <b>70+</b>	ACT   Tas
HEAVY VEHICLE	Annual medical and practical test	Applies to ages <b>80+</b>	NSW

<sup>\*</sup> Multi combinational licences in NSW are required to be annually tested for those aged 70+. | \* Licence renewal is only valid for 5 years at a time for ages 65+ in Tasmania.
