P1 Driving restrictions

1 peer passenger 11pm–5am

Passenger 16-22: ACT
Passenger <21: NSW* | Qld*

No driving 12am–5am

SA* | WA

Passenger 16-21: Tas* | Vic



Exemptions may apply.
Passenger restrictions exclude family members.

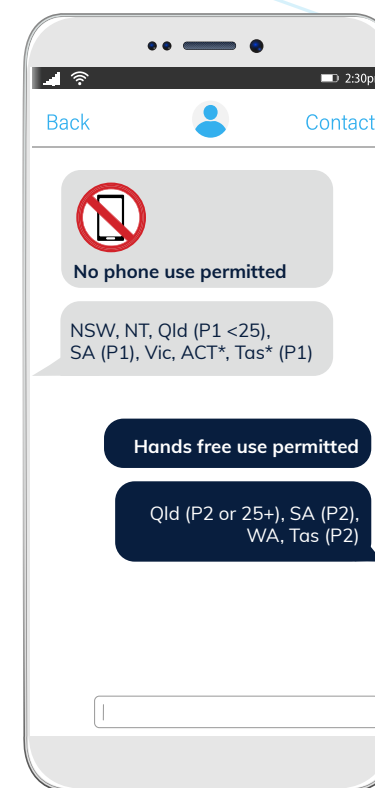


Provisional driver demerit points

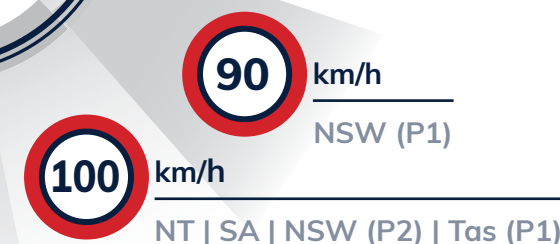

ACT	4 points	
NSW	4 points	7 points
NT	5 points	
Qld	4 points in 1 year	4 points in 1 year
SA	4 points	
Tas	4 points in 1 year	4 points in 1 year
Vic	5 points in 1 year	5 points in 1 year
WA	4 points in first year	8 points in second year

Note: If more than one threshold exists, the strictest one applies. If a provisional driver accrues more than the specified number of points in the relevant time period, their licence can be suspended or refused (varies by state/territory)


