When do I need a roadworthy inspection?



Selling a vehicle



Qld | Vic

Seller must provide a current inspection certificate



States & No certificate required

Registering a vehicle

Inspection required for same owner re-registering

NSW¹ | NT² | Vic

- 1. For most light vehicles over 5 years old
- 2. One inspection required when vehicle between 5 and 10 years old, then annually from 10 years old.

Most jurisdictions also require annual inspection for public service vehicles (eg. taxis).

Inspection required for new owner registering a used vehicle

ACT 1 | NSW 2 | NT 2 | Old | TAS

- 1. For most vehicles over 6 years old.
- 2. For most vehicles over 5 years old.



Cost of inspection for light vehicles



(government operated)

depending on the age of the vehicle, and location.

Registering a vehicle interstate

Certificate required

ACT | NSW | NT1 | Qld | SA2 | Tas | WA

- 1. Only if the vehicle is over 5 years old.
- 2. Only if the vehicle is 3 years old and over 4.5 tonnes.

Certificate not required

Vic¹

1. Only if vehicle currently registered interstate.
