



# Road Safety Data for Local Government Authorities (LGAs)

## States and territories road safety data for LGAs

All state and territory governments collect, analyse and provide road safety data to LGAs. This data can either be publically available data or require the LGA to register to receive access.

### Victoria

- LGAs in Victoria can access road safety data from the [Road Crash Information System](#) providing crash data from Victorian road incidents dating back to 1987, sourced from Victoria Police

### New South Wales

- LGAs in New South Wales can access [interactive crash statistics and interactive reports](#) from Transport for NSW Centre for Road Safety

### Queensland

- Crash details report, radial crash zones, mapbox GIS and data export, can be accessed through [Crash Analytics Reports System \(CARS\)](#).

### Northern Territory

- [Traffic count data](#) is publicly available, as well as crash data upon request for Black Spot funding, projects and road safety audits. LGAs can request crash data via email: [roadsafety@nt.gov.au](mailto:roadsafety@nt.gov.au).

## Western Australia

- [Open Data, Maps & Apps](#) is openly available for LGAs
- [Crash Analysis Reporting System \(CARS\)](#), available to local governments and consultants for detailed crash reports, crash patterns.
- Main Roads are currently in the process of developing a crash mapping system in WA called 'crash map' that will provide a relational crash mapping system for LGAs throughout WA.

## South Australia
